





Barna Research says church drop out rate has grown from a 59% (2011) to 64% (2019)

hen Barna president David Kinnaman published his 2011 book You Lost Me, we heard from many people (especially church leaders) who were shocked to learn that 59 percent of young adults with a Christian background had dropped out of church at some point during their 20s—many for just a time, but some for good.

Eight years later, research for Kinnaman's new book Faith for Exiles: 5 Ways for a New Generation to Follow Jesus in Digital Babylon reveals that the church dropput problem is still a problem. In fact, the percentage of young-adult dropouts has increased from 59 to 64 percent. Nearly two-thirds of U.S. 18–29-year-olds who grew up in church tell Barna they have withdrawn from church involvement as an adult after having been active as a child or teen.






Church Attendance Data



% OF TIME DISTRACTED



The Giving Facts¹



- ~ People are giving a lower % of income to churches in the 2000's than they did either during the Great Depression or the 1920's
- ~ 37% of church goers give \$0 to their church
- ~ 17% of American families have reduced the amount that they give to their local church
- ~ 7% of church goers have dropped regular giving by 20% or more
- ~ Parish median proxy tithe analysis shows GOA stewards typically only give between 0.5% to 0.8% of their income (not 10%)










GOA Baptisms Are Generally Declining






GOA Chrismations Are Generally Declining






GOA Weddings Are Generally Declining





Pandemic Empirical Data 1 2



- ~ By early March 2020¹, <u>59%</u> of Christians who typically attended church at least monthly said they were going less often in person because of the virus, and <u>40%</u> shifted to virtual attendance
- ~ By August, 2020², <u>91%</u> of Americans who watched services online were either "very" (54%) or "somewhat" (37%) satisfied with the experience
- ~ 92 % of respondents who previously said they went to services at least once or twice a month said they will attend physical services at least as often as before once the pandemic is fully behind them

1. Crises out of our control WILL happen – so it's critical to have a comprehensive, written Crisis Preparedness Plan




- 2. A church that does not have a fully enculturated stewardship of generosity program will suffer more significantly
- 3. A tithing parish does not suffer as much
- 4. When a typical GOA parish is impacted or closed, it should budget <u>losing between</u> 40% 50% of its income (assuming no material Stewardship income impact!) [≈ 28% loss of Non-Orthodox income (e.g., festivals and rentals) + ≈ 20% loss of parishioner nickel and diming (e.g., candles, trays, fundraisers, misc. donations)]

- 5. Having an easy online giving platform is essential
- 6. Having a high percentage of stewards who give online substantially increases your yield and reduces your losses from the disruption (e.g., 49% of all church giving is made with a credit/debit card and 60% of parishioners are willing to give to their church digitally)
- 7. You must offer as many online services, ministry events /activities, etc. as possible, so have the infrastructure, accounts and systems in place and tested well in advance

- 8. Staying in touch your parishioners, and their needs and situations is more critical than ever (and not just by email)
- 9. The more your ministries can function during the crises, the more engaged your faithful remain, the more your church fulfills its mission, and the more the generosity will be reinforced and inspire even greater generosity
- 10. You must always have a financial reserve and cushion for just such emergencies
- (P.S. You might be able to do a drive-thru Greek festival)







5 Big Summary Ideas From The Science of Generosity Studies







- 2. After they form a personal generosity opinion, people look for easy and routine ways to be generous (so parishes must make giving easy)
- 3. Reinforced by years of generosity, it becomes a habit, and being a good steward is cemented in their adult behaviors and DNA (and what they teach their children / grandchildren)




Science of Generosity Studies



- 4. A Parish should create and communicate a culture of generosity, and social networks that support generosity, for parishioners (including youth) to see themselves as a part of that generous culture
- 5. Parishes need to cultivate an attitude of abundance and gratitude, not scarcity, since most of us are blessed, and attitudes of abundance have been shown psychologically and biologically to cause people to reframe their reality and become more generous
